The Court of First Instance will comprise a central division with seat in Paris and sections in London and Munich as well as regional divisions and local divisions located in the Contracting Member States. The Court of Appeal will be located in Luxemburg. The UPC will have a wide and exclusive competence in respect of infringement and validity of European patents and European patents with unitary effect. It is planned that the UPC will start operations early 2017. The UPC is expected to become rapidly a leading patent court at international level, and its caseload can be expected to grow rapidly.
